Aim of the STEPS Project

- To strengthen the evaluation practices of evaluators and commissioners of evaluation in Indigenous settings in Australia and New Zealand so that evaluations are more strongly aligned with Indigenous evaluation principles

+ Objectives

- Identify a set of strategies and practices to enable culturally safe evaluation in Indigenous settings in Australia and New Zealand
- Rate and prioritise a set of identified strategies for use in an evaluation context
- Use the results to inform the development of recommendations, resources and actions that can be implemented by mainstream organisations to strengthen culturally safe evaluation


- Literature and scoping review

+ Phase 2 (2015 – 2017)

- Primary data collection using concept mapping methodology
- Formed a Project Advisory Group
- Brainstorming strategies
- Rating and sorting of the strategies
- Interpretation of findings
- Develop recommendations, actions

WHY THIS STUDY?

This project will identify a set of practices and strategies that need to be addressed in the funding, design and evaluation of Indigenous health programs. It will assess the importance of these practices and strategies and the feasibility of taking action to address them.

This results from this study will inform the development of resources to support good ways of doing evaluation with Indigenous communities.



HOW WILL THE STUDY BE CONDUCTED?

A concept mapping approach will be undertaken to engage stakeholders working in or supporting Indigenous evaluation. Concept mapping has **6 steps**.



WHAT IS CONCEPT MAPPING?

Concept Mapping is a participatory process to identify, organise and prioritise stakeholder's ideas to guide future planning and evaluation efforts.



Step 1: Develop a Focus Question

To ensure the planning and conduct of an evaluation benefits Indigenous people these are the things that I must think, feel, see and/ or do...



Step 2: Brainstorming

Invite participants to brainstorm practices and strategies in response to the focus question.



Step 3: Sorting

Engage participants in a face to face meeting to sort the these practices and strategies (identified in Step 2) into groups that are similar to each other.



Step 4: Rating

Engage participants to rate these practices and strategies on their importance and feasibility of taking action.



Step 5: Interpreting

Interpret the results depicted in visual maps to understand how these practices and strategies may be more or less important and feasible to taking action in different contexts.



Step 6: Utilisation

Work with the PAG members to develop resources informed by the results to support good ways of doing evaluation with Indigenous communities.

STEPS Project is informed by a set of evaluation principles ...

1. Respect Indigenous people's right to **self-determination**.
2. Actively **engage** the Indigenous community in the evaluation.
3. Respect for **diversity amongst indigenous peoples** and their **respective cultural protocols**.
4. Respect and support **Indigenous cultural values, knowledge and belief systems**.
5. Develop Indigenous **capacity** during the evaluation process.
6. **Trust, respect and reciprocity** characterises the relationship between the evaluators and the Indigenous community.
7. Evaluators demonstrate **flexibility** in carrying out the evaluation such that the evaluation is **responsive** to the needs and issues raised by the Indigenous community.
8. Evaluation contributes to broader **social change**.
9. Evaluation projects must be **relevant and findings used** in a way that meet the needs and priorities of the Indigenous community.
10. Guided by, and follow, existing institutional and/or Indigenous **codes of research ethics** or ethical principles.






Results thus far:

- Sent out approximately 120 email invitations
 - 12-15 bounced back
 - 7-10 people responding saying want to participate but did not have capacity (time?) to complete the activity
- Participants selected from AES, AHPA, ANZEA, Oxfam Australia, our professional networks and those of the PAG
- 36 participants across NZ and Australia



Results thus far:




- Of the 36 people who have participated:
 - One third of respondents are external evaluators
 - Programme facilitators or coordinators
 - Internal evaluators

- Would like more input from
 - Community representative (ie those who are the participants in evaluations)
 - Funders/commissioners of evaluation

- 126 strategies as at 6 September 2016


“Work with the community to analyse the data, using culturally relevant means”
